PSALM 45.

Eructavit cor meum.

MY heart is inditing of a good matter: I speak of the things which I have made unto the King.

- 2 My tongue is the pen of a ready writer.
 3. Thou art fairer than the children of men: full of grace are thy lips, because God hath blessed thee for ever.
 4 Gird thee with thy sword upon thy thigh, O thou most Mighty: according to thy worship and renown.
 5 Good luck have thou with thine honour: ride on, because of the word of truth, of meekness, and righteousness; and thy right hand shall teach thee terrible things.
 6 Thy arrows are very sharp and the people shall be subdued unto thee: even in the midst among the King's enemies.
 7 Thy seat, O God, endureth for ever: the sceptre of thy kingdom is a right sceptre.
 8 Thou hast loved righteousness, and hated iniquity: wherefore God, even thy God, hath anointed thee with the oil of gladness above thy fellows.
 9 All thy garments smell of myrrh, aloes, and cassia: out of the ivory palaces, whereby they have made thee glad.
 10 King's daughters were among thy honourable women: upon thy right hand did stand the queen in a vesture of gold, wrought about with divers colours.
 11 Hearken, O daughter, and consider, incline thine ear: forget also thine own people and thy father's house.
 12 So shall the King have pleasure in thy beauty: for he is thy Lord God, and worship thou him.
 13 And the daughter of Tyre shall be there with a gift: like as the rich also among the people shall make their supplication before thee.

14 The King's daughter is all glorious within: her clothing is of wrought gold.

15 She shall be brought unto the King in raiment of needle-work: the virgins that be her fellows shall bear her company, and shall be brought unto thee.

16 With joy and gladness shall they be brought: and shall enter into the King's palace.

17 Instead of thy fathers thou shalt have children: whom thou mayest make princes in all lands.

18 I will remember thy Name from one generation to another: therefore shall the people give thanks unto thee, world without end.

FIRST LESSON: Isaiah lv.

Then shall the Wardens present the Rev. C. J. Tovey to the Bishop (seated in his Chair at the Chancel-step) saying—

Reverend Father in God, we present unto you this godly and well-learned man to be admitted and installed as Canon Residentiary of this Cathedral Church.

The Bishop: Let the Declaration of Assent be made, and the Oaths taken.

The Canon-designate will then make and subscribe the Statutory Declaration and Oaths.

Then shall the Archdeacon present the Rev. A. T. Tucker, saying—

Reverend Father in God, I present unto you this our brother, to be admitted to our fellowship in the Chapter of this Cathedral Church.

Then shall the Canons-designate promise faithful compliance with the Statutes and ordinances of the Cathedral. This being done, the Bishop shall commend them to the prayers of the Congregation, after which shall be sung, all kneeling, the hymn Veni Sancte Spiritus. (H. A. M. 156).

COME, Thou Holy Spirit, come;
 And from Thy celestial home
 Shed a ray of light Divine;
 Come, Thou Father of the poor,
 Come Thou source of all our store,
 Come, within our bosoms shine:

Thou of Comforters the best,
 Thou the soul's most welcome guest,
 Sweet refreshment here below;
 In our labour rest most sweet,
 Grateful coolness in the heat,
 Solace in the midst of woe.

O most Blessed Light Divine,
 Shine within these hearts of Thine,
 And our inmost being fill;
 Where Thou art not, man hath nought,
 Nothing good in deed or thought,
 Nothing free from taint of ill.

Heal our wounds; our strength renew;
 On our dryness pour Thy dew;
 Wash the stains of guilt away:
 Bend the stubborn heart and will;
 Melt the frozen, warm the chill;
 Guide the steps that go astray.

On the faithful, who adore
 And confess Thee, evermore
 In Thy sevenfold gifts descend:
 Give them virtue's sure reward,
 Give them Thy salvation, Lord.
 Give them joys that never end.

Then the Bishop, standing up, shall say:

- V. O Lord, save Thy servants:
 R. Who put their trust in Thee.
 V. O Lord, send them help from Thy Holy place:
 R. And evermore defend them.

V. Give Thy holy angels charge over them:

R. To keep them in all their ways.

O Lord, hear our prayer.

And let our cry come unto Thee.

LET US PRAY.

O GOD, Who makest Thine angels spirits, and Thy ministers a flame of fire; Vouchsafe, we beseech Thee, to all who are called to the Order of Priesthood, and especially to these Thy servants now present before Thee, that as ministering spirits they may gather out of Thy kingdom all things that offend, and may kindle in the hearts of all that fire which Thou camest to send upon the earth; Who with the Father and the Holy Ghost, livest and reignest, ever one God world without end. *Amen.*

The Congregation being seated, the Bishop shall solemnly admit the Priests kneeling before him, to the Office of Canon.

Then shall the Bishop deliver the Mandate of Induction to the Archdeacon who shall conduct the Canons to their stalls and place them therein, saying to each in turn—

On behalf of the Dean and Chapter of this Cathedral Church, I install thee, Brother, in the stall assigned to thy Canonry and give thee the right hand of fellowship. The Lord preserve thy going out and thy coming in, from this time forth for evermore. *Amen.*

Then shall be sung the Magnificat.

The Canon Residentiary shall read the Second Lesson, II Cor. v, 18-vi, 10.

Then shall be sung the Deus Misereatur.

The Bishop: Let us pray.

 those whom Thou hast called to Thy service in this diocese,
 that they may grow daily in purity and love, in holy living
 and acceptable service, in true knowledge of Thy Word and
 Sacraments, to the advancement of Thy glory and the sal-
 vation of Thine elect: through Jesus Christ our Lord.
